Legal Assistance Referrals

Background Notes

In a small number of cases the child cannot be reunited with their parent. The plan of adoption is frequently the next choice in regard to permanency. To achieve adoption the parent must either relinquish their parental rights or the state must terminate the rights of the parents. These legal cases are managed by the Department of Justice and require a referral called a Legal Assistance Referral or LAR. Because of the serious nature of this work, a detailed account of the work completed with the parent is required. This is done through a document called a Legal Assistance Referral. This document is summary of the case and is exhaustive. As children need permanency for their well being completing the referral is expected to be timely as well as thorough.

Tasks / Assignments:

- Ask your Supervisor for a completed Legal Assistance Referral (LAR) to review. After reading the referral talk to the child's worker about the approach they took in completing the referral.
